
- Original (Old) Bonds
  - Issued May 2007
  - Purpose City contribution to Lewis & Clark Water Project
  - Principal amount \$70,000,000
  - True Interest Cost 4.43%
  - Term 30 years (final maturity November 2036)
  - Security 2nd Penny Sales Tax
  - Payments Water Enterprise Fund (user fees)



- Current Status of the Old Bonds
  - Bonds retired \$7,415,000
  - Principal outstanding \$62,585,000
  - Coupon interest rates on outstanding bonds 3.5% to 5.0%
  - Early call date November 15, 2017




- o Proposed 2017A (New) Bonds
  - Purpose Refund (pay off) the Old Bonds
  - Principal amount \$36.3 million (estimated)
  - True Interest Cost 2.00% 2.50% (estimated)
  - Term 9 years (estimated)
  - Security 2nd Penny Sales Tax
  - Payments Water Enterprise Fund (user fees)
  - Water Enterprise Fund Cash \$25.0 million



- Water Fund Cash \$25.0 million
  - Current cash balance \$39.9 million
  - Cash flow forecast collaboration with Public Works
  - Operating Reserve Target 20% to 30%
  - Capital needs pay-as-you-go
  - Lewis & Clark "True-up"








- Estimated Savings
  - Total net reduction in debt service payments \$25.2 million
  - Present value of savings \$14.4 million
    - Lower interest rates
    - Shorter term paid off in 9 years!
    - Paying down the principal immediate reduction in outstanding debt


The Savings are Truly Phenomenal!



- o Bond Ordinance
  - Authorize issuance of new bonds
  - Set parameters on bond amount, interest rate and final maturity
  - Establish uses of bond proceeds
    - Retire Old Bonds
    - Cost of issuance
    - Debt service reserve fund
    - Capitalized interest



- Next steps
  - First reading of bond ordinance tonight
  - Second reading & adoption of bond ordinance September 19th
  - Conduct competitive sale of New Bonds October/November
  - Call Old Bonds November
